Modular Training Course on Healing and Deliverance

Student Handbook

There are 2 strands to becoming a prayer minister:

1. Learning and understanding the Dunamis core model for ministry based on biblical process.
2. Practical experience.

A clear understanding of basic Christian theology and the nature of the spiritual battle experienced in this life are essential foundations for effective healing ministry. A deep and intimate relationship with God is also vital.

Only prayer ministers invited by the course moderator may take this course.

What is prayer ministry?

During Jesus' earthly ministry he brought healing, of various kinds, to those he met. He continues this ministry through his followers today, often in prayer with those who are experienced in discerning what the Holy Spirit is saying. Jesus is our healer and he is able to bring us into greater freedom to walk with him.

Purpose for DFB&I Training Course

Jesus invites us to participate in His healing ministry. Our Mission is to see God's Kingdom come on earth by advancing the Gospel of Jesus Christ, for the glory of God the Father.

Our Purpose is to equip and train Christians to partner with Jesus for the work of healing and deliverance through ministering to others by the power of the Holy Spirit. We are not providing a method of counselling or therapy.

Statement of Faith

We believe in the orthodoxy of the Christian faith as summarised by the Apostles and the Nicene Creeds.

This statement of faith does not exhaust the extent of our beliefs. The Bible itself, as the inspired and infallible Word of God that speaks with final authority concerning truth, morality, and the proper conduct of humankind, is the sole and final source of all that we believe.

Training Goals

- To be equipped and trained in key areas of biblical and practical knowledge in order to serve the Lord as ministers of healing and deliverance.
- To be able to listen to and discern guidance from the Holy Spirit in ministering to others.
- To provide a safe setting for learning and practicing prayer ministry in small groups.

By the end of the course you will:

- Have grown in your calling and experience.
- Have learned a process and explored tools to use in healing and deliverance ministry.
- Be able to extend the gospel and help renew churches through healing and deliverance ministry that is Christ-centred.

Course Information

1. Training as a prayer minister is available for members of the Dunamis Fellowship Trust, and others who are in a right relationship with God and able to comply with the Dunamis Code of Ethics and Practice.
2. The training programme is completed at the student's pace but is likely to take one year. The trainee does not have to complete the training and become accredited in order to be part of the team of prayer ministers as they will be under the authority of the lead prayer minister (point). The trainee will be encouraged to become accredited so that they may grow into this role. And be able to lead others.
3. Someone feeling called to become a prayer minister with Dunamis must receive a minimum of two personal prayer ministry appointments during the training. You may find that things are stirred up for you while doing the course and you will find these helpful.

4. Mentors

The trainee is assigned a mentor. Mentors are men and women from the Dunamis Fellowship who have gifts in healing and deliverance ministry. You will work with one of them throughout the course. The mentor will meet with the trainee at regular intervals and will facilitate the trainee to grow in knowledge and experience. They will help with their understanding of all aspects of the healing ministry.

Your mentor will help you review progress and be available during scheduled times for feedback and support.

It is desired that this relationship will be constructive and positive, however, in the event of any concern or difficulty in this relationship, do talk with them, and if need be, with one other person. If, having done this, they are then still unable to resolve it, the student may approach the Convener of the Healing Ministry.

5. We learn to cooperate with the Holy spirit in Jesus' ministry through practical experience. You are encouraged to be involved in healing prayer ministry in your local church. It will also be possible to be on ministry teams at DFB&I events such as the Dunamis Project. This will need to be arranged with the Dunamis Project track Coordinator.
6. The trainee will be available for and take part in a minimum of 8 prayer ministry sessions, led by an experienced minister, by the end of the course. The mentor

has the discretion to change this requirement if the trainee is growing at a faster or slower pace.

7. A record will be made at each prayer appointment by the trainee and mentor together of what the trainee experienced, the competence demonstrated and what further experience is needed. Feedback may be obtained from the team members after each ministry session.
8. When the trainee has experience of being a support prayer minister, and if the trainee wants to progress to being an accredited lead prayer minister (point), they may seek an assessment for satisfactory completion and competence. There will be a clear anointing for this role.
9. The trainee and mentor will agree a joint statement to be submitted for assessment. This assessment will go to the Healing VST (Vision and Strategy Team) for ratification.
10. All prayer ministers operating under the authority of Dunamis will be expected to attend training sessions to update and enhance the skills of accredited ministers, and those in training, and to ensure learning and understanding continues.
11. All prayer ministers will need to have their own annual prayer ministry appointment.
12. To retain accredited status, membership of The Dunamis Fellowship Trust must be maintained, as well as adherence to the Code of Ethics and Practice.

Q1. Who is this course for?

This course is for clergy and lay people who reside in UK.

Q2. What Can I Expect From This Course?

You will participate in and learn to do healing and deliverance ministry under the direction of the Holy Spirit. You may also experience some healing in your own life while learning how to share the same in the lives of others.

Q 3. What does this course involve?

- Attending meetings and prayer appointments mainly via zoom.
- Being mentored
- Reading
- Practical experience via zoom and in person where possible.
- Developing your own spiritual development and relationship with Jesus.

General Training Requirements

Practical Experience

You learn to cooperate with the Holy Spirit in Jesus' ministry of healing and deliverance through practical experience. This will mainly take place on Zoom but local 'in person' ministry can be attended if available.

You are welcome to attend other events such as the Dunamis Project or on-line events. This will need to be arranged with the Dunamis Project track Co-ordinators.

Course Work

Trainees will complete some review questions at the end of each module. This will help them to consolidate their learning and reflect on questions they may wish to discuss with their mentor.

(Arrangements can be made to answer verbally if requested)

Costs

Students are responsible for their own costs. You will need to purchase course manuals (see Application form) and the required reading books. You are responsible for any travel costs.

There are no membership fees or subscriptions since the Dunamis Fellowship Trust operates on a faith ministry basis and therefore relies on donations to both maintain and develop its ministries. However, there is a cost to offering this course which covers the expense of development, administration, the cost of materials and the participation of the mentors and teachers. You are asked to pray about whether you feel led to contribute.

Pre-Requisites:

1. It is preferable that participants will have attended the following Dunamis Projects (preferably on-site). Students new to this material will be able to access catch up sessions.
 - a. Dunamis Project 1-Gateways to Empowered Ministry
 - b. Dunamis Project 2 - In the Spirit's Power

Contents from the following will form part of the course material:

- c. Dunamis Project 4 - The Healing Ministry of Jesus
- d. Dunamis Project 5 - Spiritual Warfare and Kingdom Advance.

Students will be advised of their individual study content at the beginning of the training, according to their prior experience.

2. Have the endorsement of the local Pastor and a friend who can speak to the person's call and gifting for healing and deliverance ministry. References will be required.
3. Submit a completed application to the Course Coordinator.
4. Be accepted into the Course.
5. It is assumed you will have access to the internet to attend zoom meetings, watch videos and participate in prayer ministry sessions on zoom.
6. To be willing to attend local ministry where possible.

At the end of the course, those who have completed the course requirements will receive a certificate of completion. The course is concluded with a commissioning service in which there are prayers for the anointing of the Holy Spirit for healing and deliverance ministry.

Commitment for Graduation:

1. Attend at least 90% of the Teaching Modules.
2. Demonstrate a clear understanding and biblical basis of healing prayer ministry
3. Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the inner healing and deliverance process.
4. Can demonstrate team work by joining in healing ministry prayer sessions with prior agreement from the lead minister. (Some applicants will already be engaged in doing personal prayer ministry).
5. Successful completion of prayer ministry sessions (as a team member and/or point person under supervision)
6. Endorsement by their Mentor
7. Attendance at mentoring sessions as agreed with the mentor.

Mentoring Agreement**

Mentoring is a 2-way relational opportunity to grow through honest conversation, reflection, and encouragement.

It is an opportunity for the mentor to offer support from their experience and for mentees to share. It can be helpful, especially in a group mentor setting, to explore biblical aspects and challenges from the course, to pray and even have fun together! It does not mean taking on a pastoral or a counsellor role.

Though informal, there still needs to be some guidelines to help the mentoring relationship work well.

These include staying in touch regularly, keeping appointments and seeking to do the best to help each other.

We are both voluntarily entering into this partnership. During the agreed meeting times, we wish this to be a mutually respectful and rewarding experience, with freedom to discuss whatever is relevant within the mentee's role as trainee prayer minister.

1. The mentoring meetings will take place as agreed together, and at least every 2 months during training, until 12 months from the start of learning. Any further need for a mentor will be discussed with the course Coordinator.
2. The mentor will encourage and support the mentee as they progress through the prayer ministry training and ensure they are following Dunamis protocols.
3. The mentee will be willing to attend meetings as planned and actively participate.
4. The mentee will discuss their progress and to be open about challenges or difficulties.
5. The mentor agrees to be honest and provide constructive feedback to the mentee. The mentee agrees to be open to the feedback.
6. We agree to keep the content of these meetings confidential, unless safeguarding issues are raised. The mentor and mentee will follow the Dunamis Safeguarding policy.

Please speak to the Course Convenor.

Note: We follow safeguarding procedures and **everyone involved in this ministry is asked to respect the privacy of the participants in our prayer sessions but we may be required by law to report to appropriate authorities any intent of a person to take harmful, dangerous, or criminal action against another person or against themselves, and any act of child or adult abuse or neglect.**
