

Prayer Ministry Practical Considerations

One of the requirements needed for a person to become free is to have a strong desire to be set free, and you have to be willing to listen and follow instructions. We will work with you and support you. For maximum freedom, you must do the work between sessions and follow any suggestions the prayer minister requests you to take.

One of the hardest challenges for you is to renew your mind and thinking so that you can live in the truth. Seek God with all your mind, heart and soul and you will find him.

Healing is not a 'quick fix'. It takes a lot of prayers, over a period of time. We bless you in your growing freedom and look forward to praying with you.

We also expect you to be in a Christian church or fellowship where you are being supported in prayer.

In order for us to be able to minister to you effectively, we request that you follow these instructions:

Please read all the information carefully before applying for a healing ministry appointment so that you understand what to expect. We want to make sure that we use our time together as effectively as possible.

We will also be pleased to answer any questions you have at the session.

Zoom

You will need a suitable desktop computer, laptop, tablet, iPad or Smartphone to access Zoom. The larger the screen the better as you will be able to see the prayer minister clearly.

We do ask that you have a camera, speakers and microphone or a working headset compatible with Zoom, as this allows us to monitor your appearance, voice and expressions during ministry. You will also need access to a stable internet connection.

If you don't know how to open links, 'Pin' a person on screen, retrieve documents out of emails, etc... then please recruit someone ahead of time who can help you with this. The prayer minister typically sends documents, prayers and information for you to access.

English Translator

The prayer minister really needs to be able to understand you. If you have a heavy accent please understand this can be very difficult to understand over Zoom, and it may be necessary for you to have someone who can translate for you. You would be responsible for arranging this ahead of time.

This will all help to ensure that the technology doesn't get in the way of your prayer time.
